Amendment for Scholarship Policy: Would like to raise scholarship amount from \$500 to \$750. Jessica went over rules for individuals to qualify for a scholarship. There was a request made that maybe scholarships could be raised to \$1000.

Other Business: Pastor will be gone for 2 weeks in Feb. Members were wondering about finding a replacement for that period. Pastor said he has been in contact with some possible fill ins.

Jessica asked for members to write in some names for people to be on nominating committee for next year.

## Bethlehem Lutheran Church Special Congregational Meeting Sunday October 17, 2021

Call to order at 9:55 am by President Jessica Ihns Pastor Daniel opened with a prayer.

Reducing the size of council from 9 to 6 members. There was some discussion on how the number of 6 was determined. The size of voting members has been reduced – in 2020 there was 68 voting members. Reducing to 6 council members will reflect the new size of the congregation. There will still be a requirement for 5 council members to be present to make significant decisions. The request was approved by a vote of 26 - 4 to reduce council.

Land Sale – Sell strip of land between Rickels and church property. This land was donated to the church many years ago, Rickels would like to put it back with their property and offered \$600.00 plus attorney fees for said property. Ellen Pithan made the request that because the property was given to the church that we should just give it back with no dollars changing hands. Warren stated that if sold the funds would go into memorial fund. If the vote reflected a no sale out come it would go back to council for further consideration and discussion. The vote was 24 - 10 to sell the land.

Distance worship 800 number – Anyone wishing to use this number was asked to contact Pastor so he could get a number of of people using it so a discussion to keep or drop the number can be determined.

Conflict of interest – Council is seeking the congregations feedback on asking members who serve on council and committees and employees to sign a conflict of interest. Ed Sheldon spoke up against this requirement, could possibly send the wrong message to people who wish to serve our church, the feeling that we don't trust them. Others members also agree with this point. Brent Ihns spoke up for the requirement, said its only a formality of doing business. If someone doesn't want to sign then they wont be able to run for council.

Connie Kleppe requested that we should possibly look into limiting members of the same family chairing 2 committees at the same time.

No decision was made on conflict of interest at this time, President Ihns said she would take it back to council for more discussion.

Pastor Daniel gave the congregation same words of guidance to ponder over as we try to come together on the discussion of conflict of interest.

Meeting was closed with a prayer.

I invite you to read and reflect on part of Paul's letter to the church in Rome (Romans 12:2-12):

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers."

In our quickness and hurriedness, we can find ourselves seeing ourselves as not as valuable compared to another, and as one hurting person, hurt others in turn. The love of God, and the story of the cross and empty tomb declare this to be pain for no purpose. May you, as sisters and brothers, go forth in the confidence that you are called and valued as members of the body of Christ. As we continue into a new year that already is forever changing and sometimes feels like standing on shifting sands, may you remember your worth. Despite everything that may go wrong; all the trials and difficulties we make for ourselves or are thrust upon us, I look forward to sharing more moments with all you, so that we all may continue to grow into the people God calls us to be.

### **BWELCA 2021 REPORT**

Quilting began Jan. 4 with social distancing implemented. We had 2 groups, some met on Mondays, and some met on Wednesdays through March 15. Even with fewer quilters, we set a record of 210 quilts, (maybe 2 days / week made the difference, but what a dedicated group!) and 4 pillows. The quilts were sent to: the Domestic Violence Intervention Program in Iowa City, The King House and High Tower in Clinton, Lutheran Services of Iowa- Clinton, Davenport, and Muscatine, Union Presbyterian Church in Lost Nation, 33 quilts were given to LWR, 3 were given to local benefits. 12 quilts/ wall hangings were sent to EWALU for their annual Quilt Auction in September, and 3 Quilts of Valor were presented at the Annual Veterans Day Event.

Our annual Cheer Brunch was cancelled due to Covid, but several women assembled 34 cheer plates and on Feb.20 distributed them. The Friendship Party was also cancelled due to Covid.

The World Day of Prayer was observed on Mar. 7 with a noisy offering of \$67.12 including our budgeted amount of \$25.00. The Republic of Vanuatu in the South Pacific was the focal country this year.

The Lenten soup suppers were cancelled due to the Covid.

We packed 64 layette kits and 88 health kits in March. They were delivered to LWR along with the guilts.

The Spring Quilt Display and Luncheon was held on Mar.20 with carryouts only in place of the Bazaar

The Senior/Senior Celebration was held on Sunday April 18 with Callie Petersen being our only graduating senior.

We had a small group for church cleaning on Sunday April 25. Some small projects inside and out were completed, and all enjoyed pop & pizza courtesy of the Endowment Committee.

We did not have the Community Coffee in June due to Covid, but the Ice Cream Social was held as a drive thru/carryout. It was very successful as we served 155.

In July we helped with the Rustic Days Ecumenical Brunch, which was hosted by the OLOHR. Approximately 65 attended.

Restrictions prevented us from serving a meal for the DVIP residents, but we purchased a gift card for meals for them and in August delivered cookies, corn, and watermelon as well as food items that were gathered from Bethlehem and St. Marks.

In September was election of officers and we welcomed Kelly Schroeder to the Board as Mission Growth/Stewardship position.

We packed 128 school kits for LWR in September & October.

The EWALU Quilt Auction was held September 18. Bethlehem's quilts brought \$665.

On October 1 several women traveled to Cuba City Wisconsin to visit Stella Franck for a lunch out and a tour of her church rounded out the day.

Other Fall activities were Treat the Food Pantry, The Harvest Table, and the Thankoffering Service all coordinated by the Mission Community/ Justice Committee.

On December 5, we decorated the church after worship and enjoyed brunch for our joint Circle Christmas Party at the Pub Club.

#### Farm Committee 2021

The Farm Committee met in early August as a group and with the renter, Keith Dexter. Before the time of the meeting, the Committee received an unsolicited offer at a higher rental rate than currently being paid. The Committee decided that we were happy with Keith and would allow him the opportunity to make an offer that he felt was fair and with which he was comfortable. It was decided by the Committee to not disclose the unsolicited offer rate and allow Keith to make his decision bias free. It was decided that if Keith's offer was less than the unsolicited offer that the lease with Keith would be terminated and the farm would be put out for public bid. Keith's rental offer came in higher than the unsolicited offer and Committee decided to proceed with renting the farm to Keith for the next year. Keith did request different payment terms with the new rate which would be ½ payment March 1<sup>st</sup> and ½ payment October 1<sup>st</sup> instead of a payment in January and July. The new rental payment for 2022 will be \$43,837.50.

Change and the need for creativity have become constants over the last year and a half in many aspects of life, including the church. This was the case for Living Christ Lutheran Church in Flagstaff, Ariz., even before a global pandemic caused many of us to rethink what it means to be church. Generosity from all three expressions of the ELCA (the churchwide organization, the Grand Canyon Synod and members of Living Christ) helped turn a congregation "on the road out of town, near the mall" into an online presence reaching over 500 people a week from Phoenix to the Philippines. (Read more about Living Christ in the current issue of "Stories of Faith in Action" at ELCA.org/SOFIA.)

Many other congregations have found new ways to connect both when inperson worship was impossible and when congregations began to return to their sanctuaries. Generosity, especially through Mission Support, helped us find and support these new ways of being connected. Early in the pandemic, ELCA Worship launched the "Worship in the Home" webpage, with Scripture, hymn links, prayers and reflections for each

Sunday. These resources were and continue to be used in congregations across the ELCA—even at **Sitka Lutheran Church** in Alaska, whose members printed and hand-delivered "Worship in the Home" resources to fellow members without internet access.

Change and creativity have taught us many things. As Pastor Sandra Rudd of Sitka Lutheran Church noted, "The pandemic was a stark illustration of the fact that the church is not a building. A lot of people say that, but we didn't fully know it until we didn't have a building to use. We learned that there are many ways to be connected as the church." Throughout the pandemic, the ELCA has changed and adapted, doing ministry in new and creative ways, because of the generosity of its members. Even now, you may be gathering in a new way for your annual meeting, to discern how you will steward the gifts shared generously with your congregation to do ministry in your community and beyond. As you have these important conversations, remember that your gifts of time, talent and resources have helped create new spaces beyond our walls and buildings where we continue to worship, serve and love God and each other.
