### Shepherding Thoughts,

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

(John 10:19)

Peace is fragile and sometimes hard to find in our world. Peace seems to hide from violence. In the reading from John, Jesus appears to his disciples after his violent death, showing them that peace had won the battle over violence. Violence did not have the last word. Jesus rose to show us that peace is possible.

"The peace of Christ be with you always." We hear those words every week in worship and the response is "and also with you." Has this become just another part of worship, or do we really think about how powerful these words are for us and for all who yearn for peace in their lives? This gift of peace can give us hope for the days ahead.

Originally, sharing the peace was exchanged only between close family members in the privacy of their homes. When it expanded to the church, it was considered scandalous until it was decided that it was important to expand the love of close family members to include our siblings in Christ.

Sharing the peace in worship is always done before collecting the offering and coming to the table for Holy Communion. It was thought that before you give to the Lord and receive the body and blood of Jesus Christ you should resolve any problems you have with those around you. You are to resolve conflict and come to the Lord with a clean heart. This is done by shaking the hands of those you disagree with and offer them peace.

Although we may not have conflicts with those around us, it is still important to offer them a sign of peace. Whether it be a handshake, a nod of the head, or another sign, I hope we do it with sincerity and remember Jesus words, "peace be with you." It is the peace of Jesus Christ that we all need to share. May that peace comfort you and get you through the days when peace seems so far away.
